प्रदेश के 141 संस्थान को पीछे छोड़कर पाया मुकाम, मिला एक लाख इनाम

सिरमौर जिला में नए सरकारी क्षेत्र के कालेज किस गति से आगे बढ़ रहे हैं इस बात को कफोटा कालेज ने सही साबित किया है। राजकीय महाविद्यालय कफोटा को शिमला में आयोजित राज्य स्तरीय कार्यक्रम में प्रदेश सरकार की ओर से हिमाचल प्रदेश में टियर-3 कालेजों में प्रथम रैंक हासिल हुआ है। हिमाचल प्रदेश सरकार द्वारा सचिवालय में प्रदेश के महाविद्यालयों के प्राचार्यों की बैठक के दौरान उच्च शिक्षा निदेशालय द्वारा पूरे हिमाचल प्रदेश में कालेज रैंकिंग में टियर-3 कालेजों में राजकीय महाविद्यालय कफोटा को प्रथम रैंक प्राप्त होने पर एक लाख रुपए और प्रमाण पत्र पुरस्कार के तौर पर दिया गया। यह

## **Admission Procedure**

Furnishing of false information or suppression of any material fact(s) in the Online Application form(s) would render immediate disqualification of the Applicant(s).

### **Important Instructions regarding filling up of online application(s) form(s):**

1. Applicant(s) are required to apply online through college official website i.e. **www.gdckaffota.ac.in**. No other means/modes of application are acceptable.
2. Applicant(s) must have a valid Email ID and Mobile Number before registering and creating login credentials.
3. Applicant(s) must verify the email before logging in. It is a one-time process.
4. Verification mail may reflect in inbox or spam folder of the email account holder.
5. After creating login credentials, applicant(s) need to login with these credentials. He/she will be redirected to dashboard page, from where he/she can apply for the relevant course.
6. Applicant(s) need to click on "[Click Here to Apply](#)" link, to apply for the Course.
7. Applicant(s) should carefully fill all the information asked in the Form and then SAVE it.
8. The Applicant(s) is required to upload at the appropriate web links provided for that purpose:
  - Matriculation or Date of Birth Certificate, in support of his date of birth/proof of age.
  - 10+2 mark sheet for merit generation.
  - Character certificate (issued by the competent authority)
  - Migration certificate (for students belonging to boards other than HP)
  - The category certificates for claiming reservation, fees relaxation, age relaxation etc. Against their respective category, they do belong to.
  - Size of documents should not exceed 1MB.
9. The Applicant(s) is also required to upload his/her recent photograph image.
  - Size of the photograph (passport size) should not exceed 50 KB. (Ht. X Wd. = 4.5 X 3.5 cm)
10. Only the applications of applicants who fulfill all the requisite eligibility criteria will be accepted by the system.
11. Applicant(s) will not be allowed to edit their application form after its final submission.
12. Pay registration fee online.
13. The application form will be verified by the admission committee.
  - i) If approved then pay admission fees online.
  - ii) If conditionally approved, then make requisite corrections by editing the form and resubmit it. Then pay admission fee after approval by college authorities.
  - iii) If eligibility conditions are not fulfilled, then form will be rejected.

## Mode of Payment

The fees of all type prescribed for the Applicant(s) are mentioned in prospectus.

**However, the Applicant(s) are required to follow below mentioned procedure to pay the fees:-**

After submitting application, "**Pay registration fee**" link will be visible in the second grid of dashboard page.

Applicant(s) will be able to see applications submitted by them in the application status grid with fees payment (registration fees) status. "**Pay registration fee**" link will be available there only for those applicants for which the prospectus fees is not paid.

Only one option will be available after clicking on Pay Now link for Registration.

Online Payment – Applicant(s) can pay using **Net banking, UPI (Google Pay, Phone Pay, Paytm, Bhim etc)** for Online Payment to the college.

No payment will be accepted after the last date of submission of application form as mentioned in notification. The candidature of such Applicant(s) shall be liable to be rejected straightway without further communication.

## **Admission Rules and Eligibility Conditions**

The Minimum qualification prescribed for admission to the courses and examination leading to the degree course of the university shall be in accordance with the first ordinance of HP University 1973 (clause 1.4 Chapter-1) Any student who is seeking admission in the college in any Faculty / Course has to fulfil the following eligibility condition/Rules (clause 3.3 A of Chapter III Vol.1) of the Ordinance of HP University.

**Students seeking admission in B.A./B.Com 2nd & 3rd year will have to take roll-on admission without waiting for the previous result. However, their admissions shall be purely provisional and subject to the result of previous class.**

### **A. Academic Qualification**

#### **B.A.-I (Pass Course)**

To be eligible for seeking admission to B.A.-1 (Pass Course) the candidate should have passed:

(I) 10+2 examination or an equivalent examination from any recognized Board/University established by law in India with 4 written subjects (including English) with at least 33% marks.

(II) Intermediate examination of Indian University/Board or any examination recognized equivalent thereto (pass in four subjects, one language and three other elective) with at least 33% marks.

#### **B. Com.-I (Pass Course)**

To be eligible for seeking admission to B.com-I (pass course) the candidate should have passed:

(I) 10+2 examination (commerce stream) with minimum 40% is eligible for admission in 1st year of the course.

(II) A student who has passed +2 or equivalent exams other than commerce stream in four written subjects (including English) with Economics or Mathematics as compulsory subject at +2 levels with 45% marks is eligible for admission in 1st year of the course.

(III) For girl candidate the eligibility is pass percentage i.e. 33%.

#### **Remarks:**

While determining percentage of marks for eligibility, rounding off of fraction of 0.5 or above to the next full unit is permissible. A relaxation of 5% is available to SC/ST candidates for admission to B.Sc./B.Com 1st year.

#### **Important Note:**

At any stage, if any student is found to claim his/her basic eligibility qualification from fake or unrecognized Board/University, his/her admission shall stand automatically cancelled. The College shall not be responsible for cancellation of admissions.

## **B. Age Limit**

For admission to the 1st year of any course a student must not be more than 23 years (25 years for girls) of age as on 1st July 2026 e.g. the applicant should not be born earlier than 01-07-2003 in case of boys and 01-07-2001 in case of girls. However, in r/o SC and ST Students, a relaxation of 3 years is given.

The Vice-Chancellor of HPU Shimla has the power to permit age relaxation up to a maximum of 6 months. All such cases will be granted age relaxation provisionally up to six months by the Principal and a consolidated list of such cases will be sent for approval of the Vice-Chancellor by 31st October of every Academic Year. A candidate who has availed age relaxation at the time of first admission shall be eligible for the same in the subsequent classes also.

## **Registration and Migration**

For registration to this university students have to apply online at <https://nrme.hpshimla.in/>

After applying online and payment of requisite fees, students have to submit hard copy of Registration Form with the following documents in college office:

1. Self-attested copy of Matric
2. Self-attested copy of 10+2
3. Original migration certificate

**Note:** Registration on [https://nrme.hpshimla.in](https://nrme.hpshimla.in/) is compulsory for all students.

### **Directions for Migration**

I. Open the registration portal <http://nrme.hpshimla.in/> click on student activity and choose inter-college migration.

II. Select your program type and enter your user ID and password (which you have received while filling the registration/examination form) then click on login.

III. Student details will be automatically fetched there, give the appropriate reason of migration and choose the college where candidate wants to migrate and then click on Apply, then note down your reference number.

IV. Your application will be sent to both colleges for approval through clerk and principal user ID.

V. Candidate can check his/her application status on the status section using reference number.

VI. After the approval of both colleges and university the payment option will be activated, then click on the payment and pay the migration fee rupees five hundred (Rs. 500.00) through online using credit card/Debit card and Net Banking. After successful completion of the payment candidate can download his/her inter-college migration certificate.

## **Instructions to Students — Undergraduate Programmes Under HPU-UGP NEP-2020 Framework (Session 2026-27 Onwards)**

**B.A. (Bachelor of Arts) / B.Com. (Bachelor of Commerce)**

**IMPORTANT:** From the academic session 2026–27, all undergraduate programmes of Himachal Pradesh University are conducted under the Semester System in accordance with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and the Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (HPU-UGP) duly notified by Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla. This college, being affiliated to HPU, shall implement the said framework from session 2026–27. Students are advised to read these instructions carefully before and after filling the admission form.

### **1. Introduction**

Himachal Pradesh University (HPU), Shimla, has notified the Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes (HPU-UGP) for implementation in all its affiliated colleges with effect from the academic session 2026–27. This has been approved by the Executive Council, duly endorsed by the Secretary (Education), Government of Himachal Pradesh (vide Notification No. EDUA-009/7/2025-278440-NEP dated 01-04-2026), and further approved by the Standing Committee of the Academic Council of HPU in its meeting held on 05-05-2026 and notified by the Registrar, HPU vide No. 7-1/2026-HPU(Acad) dated 13<sup>th</sup> May 2026. Himachal Pradesh University has adopted the Semester System at the Undergraduate Level in all Degree Colleges in the State from the academic session 2026-27.

The key features of the HPU-UGP framework are:

- Himachal Pradesh University has adopted the Semester System at the Undergraduate Level in all Degree Colleges in the State from the academic session 2026-27.
- Introduction of Multiple Entry and Exit Options — students may earn a Certificate, Diploma, or Degree at different stages.
- A Credit-Based System replacing the conventional marks-based annual structure.
- Emphasis on Multidisciplinary, Holistic, and Skill-based Education.
- Mandatory Internship / Apprenticeship / Community Engagement / Field-based Learning as integral academic components.
- Integration with the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) — a national digital repository of student credits.
- Provision for SWAYAM/MOOCs-based credit earning as notified by HPU/UGC.

## 2. Programmes Offered

In accordance with the Notification No. EDUA-009/7/2025-278440-NEP dated 01-04-2026 of the Secretary (Education), Government of Himachal Pradesh; the Four-Year Degree Programme shall initially be implemented only in selected Government Degree Colleges notified separately by the Government. This college, therefore, offers the Three-Year (6-Semester) Undergraduate Programme only at this stage.

Note: This college offers the Three-Year (6-Semester) Programme only. Students wishing to pursue the Four-Year B.A./B.Com. (Honours) or (Honours with Research) will need to migrate to a notified Four-Year Programme college after completing their Three-Year degree from this college, subject to seat availability and eligibility as per HPU and Government of Himachal Pradesh norms.

## 3. Programmes Structure and Credit Framework

Under HPU-UGP, the undergraduate programme is structured on a credit system spread over six semesters. Each academic year comprises two semesters. The minimum credit distribution for the Three-Year B.A./B.Com. programme is as follows:

### **3.1 Explanation of Course Categories / Components**

- **Discipline Specific Courses – Major (DSC):** These are the core courses in the student's primary subject(s) of study. In-depth knowledge of the major discipline is imparted through these courses, and the degree is awarded in the major discipline.
- **Minor Courses (MC):** Courses from disciplines other than the student's Major. These encourage multidisciplinary learning and broaden academic exposure.
- **Multidisciplinary Courses (MDC):** Introductory-level courses drawn from a pool of disciplines other than the Major and Minor, meant to provide breadth of knowledge.
- **Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):** Language and communication-focused courses (English, Hindi, or Sanskrit) to strengthen linguistic and communicative abilities.
- **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** Practical, vocational, and soft-skill courses designed to enhance employability, drawn from the discipline-specific pool.
- **Value Addition Courses (VAC):** Common courses for all UG students covering themes such as Environmental Studies, Indian Constitutional Values, Ethics, and Indian Knowledge Systems.
- **Internship / Apprenticeship / Community Engagement / Field-based Learning (I/A/C/F):** Mandatory experiential learning component. The nature of this component is determined at the end of Semester I to allow students to undertake I/A/C/F activities during the winter vacation.

### **3.2 Subject Combinations — B.A.**

Students admitted to B.A. must choose subjects as follows at the time of admission:

1. **Major Subject A and Major Subject B (Two Core/DSC subjects):** To be chosen from: Economics, English, Hindi, History, Political Science, Music (Instrumental).
2. **Minor Course Subject C (One Minor):** To be chosen from the remaining subjects available at this college, other than those chosen as Major A and Major B.

MDC, AEC, SEC, and VAC courses will be chosen at the commencement of each semester as per HPU guidelines and college availability.

### **3.3 Subject Combination — B.Com.**

Commerce is the core (Major) discipline for B.Com. students. All DSC/Major courses are drawn from Commerce as per the HPU-notified B.Com. programme structure. B.Com. students shall additionally undertake Minor, MDC, AEC, SEC, and VAC courses as per HPU-UGP.

### **3.4 Multidisciplinary Courses (MDC) Available**

The Multidisciplinary Course (MDC) must be selected from a discipline/pool other than the student's Major and Minor subjects. The following MDCs are available at this college as per the HPU-notified syllabi:

### **3.5 Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)**

As per HPU-UGP guidelines, AEC must be in a language other than the language(s) studied as Major/Minor (DSC). A maximum of two language courses can be opted for as Core and Minor. The AEC must be in English, Hindi, or Sanskrit (other than what is studied in DSCs/Minors). But as this college has sanctioned teaching posts in English and Hindi only, the college-specific condition is:

A maximum of ONE language course can be opted for as Core/DSC and Minor combined, keeping in view the availability of sanctioned posts at this college. AEC should be in a language other than the language(s) chosen as Major/Minor by the student.

### **3.6 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC)**

Two Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC-1 and SEC-2) are to be chosen. These must be from the discipline-specific (DSC/Major or Minor) as per HPU guidelines.

### **3.7 Internship / Apprenticeship / Community Engagement / Field-Based Learning**

A key aspect of the HPU-UGP is induction of students into actual work situations, community experiences, or field-based learning. This is a mandatory credit-bearing component of the programme. The nature of I/A/C/F activity for a student will be determined at the end of Semester I, so that the student can carry out the activity during the winter vacation after Semester I. Detailed guidelines shall be issued by HPU and the college at the appropriate time.

### **3.8 Subject Change**

Requests for change of course/subject shall be considered only according to HPU regulations and within prescribed timelines.

**Note:** The College reserves the right to offer, withdraw, or modify subject combinations/ courses depending upon Himachal Pradesh University regulations, government directions, sanctioned posts, and teacher availability or any other administrative reason.

## **4. Multiple entry And Exit Options**

The HPU-UGP framework, as notified, provides the following Multiple Entry and Exit Options, offering flexibility to students:

**Re-Entry:** Students who exit at the Certificate or Diploma level may re-enter the programme **WITHIN THREE YEARS** of exit and complete the degree. The maximum permissible time to complete any UG programme is **SEVEN YEARS** from the date of first admission. Re-entry is subject to seat availability and HPU regulations.

**28.1. Significant Notes**

1. The prescribed credit weightage includes Lecture, Tutorial, and Practical components.
2. In the first semester, students will be offered three different subjects within the same stream: A, B, and C (Core and Minor are provided here for illustrative purposes only).
3. At the end of the second semester, each student may choose one of two programmes: the Multi-Disciplinary/Interdisciplinary or Single Core Discipline (Major) programme. The student choosing the latter will be required to give his/her Major and Minor at the end of the second semester. Such choices, including DSCs made at the end of the second semester, shall remain in effect until the VI semester.
4. Additional Seats: The Colleges may create 10% extra seats over and above the sanctioned strength to accommodate the request for a change of major. Any unfilled or vacant seats may be filled with those seeking a change of Major. Preference will be given to those with the highest CGPA and no arrears in the first year/semester.
5. The DSCs of another discipline for the first two semesters of students who opt for Major programmes will be treated as Minors.
6. A DSC offered in one discipline will be treated as a Minor by another. Students can choose Minor Courses from two different subjects, but must earn a minimum of 12 credits in each.
7. MDCs must be selected from a broad discipline/pool of MDCs other than Major and Minor disciplines/subjects.
8. AEC/VAC/SEC-3 should be chosen from a pool of courses. Every discipline shall provide these courses, some of which will be offered discipline-specific, while the rest can be open to students of all other disciplines. However, the two SECs (SEC-1 & SEC-2) must be chosen from the discipline-specific (Core and Minor).
9. A maximum of two language courses can be opted for as Core and Minor. AECs should be in a language other than what is studied in DSCs/Minors.
10. I/A/P/C will be determined at the end of the first semester to enable students to carry out some I/A/P/C activities during winter vacation.
11. To pursue an Honours & Honours with research in the 4th year, students will have to successfully complete 3-year UG Degree and choose only one discipline in both semesters, in which s/he have studied 6 DSCs and 5 DSEs in the first three years.
12. A student who secures 75% or more marks in aggregate till semester 6 (up to a 3-year degree) shall be eligible for a 4-year degree Honours with Research, provided HPU has approved the college to offer it.
13. One course per semester (DSC/Minor/MDC/SEC/etc) from a subject offered in two (or more) different programs (e.g. BCA and BSc/ BPA and BA/ BFA and BA/ Shastri and BA/etc) must be the same.
14. Students in the BA programmes can opt for only one DSC each from the Bachelor of Performing Arts (Dance, Music, Vocal & Instrument/Tabla/ etc.) and the Bachelor of Fine Arts (Painting/Applied Arts/Sculpture/ etc.).
15. Major and Minor shall be awarded on fulfilment of the following conditions: For Major, 64 credits in a 3-year & 84 credits in a 4-year UG programme in a single Major Discipline. For Minor 28 credits in 4-year UG programme in a single Minor Discipline
16. The Dissertation and Project will start in the VII semester. However, the evaluation and assessment will be conducted in both the VII and VIII semesters.

*\*As this scheme is being introduced for the first time, it is subject to modifications. Any changes applied in subsequent years after admission to the 1st Year will be retrospectively applicable.*

## **6. Examination, Assessment and Grading System**

### **6.1 Assessment Pattern**

Each course shall be assessed through Internal Assessment (IA) conducted by the college and an End-Semester Examination (ESE) conducted by HPU. The weightage of IA and ESE shall be as per the syllabi / evaluation scheme notified by HPU for each course.

- Internal Assessment shall include assignments, class tests, seminars, presentations, and practicals conducted on a continuous basis throughout the semester.
- End-Semester Examinations shall be conducted by Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla, at the end of each semester.
- Students must secure the minimum required marks/grades in IA, in ESE, and in the aggregate to pass a course, as prescribed by HPU.

### **6.2 Grading System**

The HPU-UGP uses a Grade Point-based system. Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) shall be computed as per HPU norms. Letter Grades awarded are: O (Outstanding), A+ (Excellent), A (Very Good), B+ (Good), B (Above Average), C (Average), D (Pass), F (Fail).

### **6.3 Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) — Mandatory Registration**

As per the HPU-UGP framework and UGC directives, registration on the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) is mandatory for all students. The ABC is a national digital repository ([abc.gov.in](http://abc.gov.in)) that stores credits earned by each student across their academic journey, enabling credit transfer and mobility.

- Every student admitted to this college for session 2026–27 must register on the ABC portal ([abc.gov.in](http://abc.gov.in)) using their Aadhaar number and generate their unique ABC ID.
- ABC ID must be furnished at the time of examination registration. Credits earned at HPU will be deposited in the student's ABC account by the university.
- The ABC facilitates seamless credit transfer if a student moves to another institution, and is the basis for awarding Certificates, Diplomas, and Degrees under the Multiple Entry and Exit system.

### **6.4 SWAYAM / MOOCs Courses**

Students may earn credits through SWAYAM/MOOC courses as per the guidelines notified by HPU/UGC from time to time. These credits, once earned and transferred to the ABC, may be counted towards the total credit requirement subject to HPU regulations.

### **6.5 Attendance Requirements**

- A student must maintain a minimum of 75% attendance in each course to be eligible to appear in the End-Semester Examination.
- Students with attendance below 75% in any course shall be detained from that course's End-Semester Examination as per HPU ordinances.
- Genuine cases (medical or otherwise) of shortage of attendance shall be considered on merit as per HPU rules.

## **6.6 Promotion and Progression**

Students shall be promoted from one semester to the next in accordance with HPU's Examination and Grading Ordinance/Notifications. However, a student can progress to the 4th Year (Semester VII & VIII) only after clearing all courses of the first three years (Semesters I to VI), applicable only in notified Four-Year Programme colleges.

### **Choice Based Credit System (CBSC) For Undergraduate Programmes Under the Annual System For 2<sup>ND</sup> And 3<sup>RD</sup> Year Students of the Academic Batches 2025-28 and 2024-27**

The Himachal Pradesh University vide Letter No. 2-1/2012 H.P.U. (Academic) dated 4 June 2016 has notified the acceptance of the latest course curriculum under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) brought out by the University Grant Commission for implementation of academic session 2019-20.

### **Basic Outline of Choice Based Credit System**

**1. Core Course:** 12 for general courses; 4 discipline specific papers each for regular courses and 2 papers each for English and Hindi/MIL in B.A./B.Com.

**2. Elective Course:** Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.

**Discipline Specific Elective (DSE):** (2 each for regular courses): An elective course offered under the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.

**Generic Elective (GE) Course:** (2 each for B.A./B.Com. regular courses): An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice is called a Generic Elective.

**3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):** The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). AECC courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge enhancement. (i) Environmental Science and (ii) English/Hindi/MIL Communication/Sanskrit. These are mandatory for all disciplines. SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.

**Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):** Environmental Science, English Communication/Hindi Communication/MIL Communication/Sanskrit.

**Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** (4 for regular courses): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on training/field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability.

## Scholarships

A number of scholarships are available for the eligible and deserving students. Information regarding dates, eligibility conditions and procedure for applying for these scholarships will be notified on the college notice board from time to time. The students may apply online for these scholarships through portal <https://scholarships.gov.in/>. The application should be duly attested/verified by the competent authority and should be accompanied by the relevant certificates of Educational Qualification/Income/Category/Domicile/College Fee Receipt/Aadhaar No. and Bank Account No. etc.

### State Sponsored Scholarship Schemes

#### 1. IRDP Scholarship Scheme:

The students who belong to IRDP families may apply for these scholarships with required documents. A sum of Rs. 1200/- per annum is provided as financial assistance.

#### 2. Financial Assistance to the children of the armed Forces Personnel killed/ disabled during the different War/Operations:

Children of armed force personnel killed/disabled in the different wars/operations are eligible for the assistance. Application proformas are available with district Sainik Welfare Board. A sum of Rs. 1200/- per annum is provided as financial assistance.

#### 3. Indira Gandhi Utkrisht Chhatravriti Yojna for post plus two students:

The Indira Gandhi Utkrisht Chhatravriti Yojna for the post plus two courses shall be awarded to 150 students @ Rs. 10,000/- p.a. per students purely on the basis of the merit and without any income ceiling. The Scholarship will also be awarded to ten toppers each from the merit list of 10+2 Arts, Science and Commerce, supplied by H.P. Board of School Education Dharamshala, provided they join any academic/professional stream. The scholarship will be renewed every year to the same number of students till they complete degree/course.

#### 4. Kalpana Chawla Chhatravriti Yojna:

This is a state sponsored scheme started from the year 2012-13. Under the scheme the top 2000 meritorious girl students of 10+2 of all study groups i.e. Science, Arts and Commerce streams are awarded a scholarship of Rs. 15,000/- per students per annum based on aggregate marks in 10+2. The merit list is supplied by HP Board of School Education, Dharamshala. The scholarship will be renewed every year till completion of course subject to the condition that the student.

### Centrally Sponsored Scholarship Schemes

5. **Post-Matriculation Scholarship for SC students:** For students belonging to SC category whose parents' annual income does not exceed Rs.2,50,000/-

6. **Post-Matric Scholarship scheme for ST students:** For students belonging to ST category whose parents/guardian income from all sources does not exceed Rs. 2,00,000/-

7. **Post-Matriculation Scholarship Scheme to OBC students:** The students belonging to OBC category are entitled for this scholarship if the annual income of their parents is up to Rs. 1,00,000/-

8. **Maharishi Balmiki Chhatravriti Yojna:** The scholarship under this scheme @ Rs. 9000/- per year is given to the Bonafide Himachali Girls Students belonging to Balmiki families, engaged in unclean occupation. The concerned students must apply

on prescribed proforma through their head of the school/college/Institution alongwith certificate.

9. **Merit-Cum means Scholarship for Students belonging to Minority Community (Centrally Sponsored Scheme):** The annual income of the parents/guardians of the beneficiaries should not exceed Rs. 2.5 Lakhs from all sources and the students should have secured less than 55% marks or equivalent grade in the previous final examination.
10. **Post-Matric Scholarship scheme for Students belonging to Minority (Centrally Sponsored Scheme):** The annual income of the parents/Guardians of the beneficiaries should not exceed Rs. 2 Lakh from all sources and the students should not have secured less than 50% marks or equivalent grade in the previous final examination. Students must have passed the examination from government/Government-Aided institutions.
11. **Post matric Scholarship for Students with Disabilities:** This scheme is available to students with disabilities who are covered under the person with disabilities (Equal opportunity, protection of rights and full participation) Act, 1995. Scholarship under the scheme will be awarded by the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Department of Disability Affairs, Government of India. Scholarship will be paid to the students whose parents/Guardian's income from all sources does not exceed Rs. 2,50,000/- per annum.
12. **Scholarship for Children of Mine Workers:** The scheme is sponsored by the Ministry of Labour and Employment, Government of India. Either of the parents of the students should be a beedi worker or a mine worker (Iron Ore/Manganese Ore/Chrome Ore Mines, Limestone/Dolomite or Mica or a cine worker) for six months at least, this would also include contract labourers. Total income of both the parents of the students from all sources should not exceed 10,000 p.m. including all allowance. The scholarship under this scheme is Rs. 3000/- per year.
13. **Dr. Ambedkar Post Matric Scholarship:** This scheme is for Economically Backward Class (EBC)/General category students belonging to General category and total income of parents/guardian shall not exceed Rs. 1.00 lakh per annum.

**Government College Kaffota has introduced two new scholarship schemes to encourage students towards academic excellence and reward outstanding performance in studies. These scholarships are awarded every year to meritorious students of the college on the basis of their academic achievements.**

14. The first scholarship, titled the “**Pundir Travels Academic Excellence Scholarship,**” has been initiated by noted social worker Mr. Atar Singh Pundir of Dugana village. Under this scheme, two deserving students of the third year are selected every year on the basis of their First and Second Year CGPA. Each selected student is awarded a scholarship amount of **₹2100** as recognition of their excellent academic performance.
15. The second scholarship, named the “**Jimoli Devi Memorial Academic Excellence Scholarship,**” has been started by social worker Mr. Mamraj Sharma in the loving memory of his mother, Mrs. Jimoli Devi. This scholarship is awarded annually to the best-performing student of the second year based on academic performance in the first year. The selected student receives a scholarship amount of **₹2100**.  
Through these scholarship initiatives, the college aims to inspire students to work harder, achieve academic excellence, and create a more competitive and quality-oriented educational environment within the institution.

### Discipline and Conduct

The Principal has power to take disciplinary action against student indulging in acts of indiscipline, which may lead to fine, suspension, rustication or expulsion.

*The following activities will be considered as violation of the college discipline and may result in fine/expulsion or rustication depending on the gravity of the offence:*

- Violence, use of force and ragging.
- Making noise and disturbing classes.
- Breaking college furniture, doors, windows, etc.
- Bringing outsider to the college campus.
- Interfering with electrical wiring/appliances.
- Writing/defacing walls and blackboards.
- Eve-teasing
- Smoking, use of Gutka or any intoxicant.

**Playing Songs/Music on mobile phones in the campus is strictly prohibited and any violation of this instruction will be considered act of indiscipline.**

### College Library

The issuance of the books is between **10:00 AM to 3:00 PM** on all working days. A student must bring his/her library card to get the books issued in his/her name. Only two books are issued to a student at a time for a period of 14 days. **Reference Books/ Dictionaries/ Newspapers/ Periodicals will not be issued.** If the issued books are not returned by due date, a fine at the rate of Rs. 1 per book per day will be charged. Internal damage to a book will invite a fine of Rs. 50/- in addition to recovery of cost of the book. Failure to return the book or to pay the penalty imposed will entail the same procedure for recovery as in the case of recovery of govt. property.

## Re-Admission

The students absent for **6 days continuously** from any class without proper sanctioning of leave by the competent authority of the college, his/her name automatically will be struck off from the rolls. A student absent for **10 days in a month** will also be deleted from rolls. Readmission will be entertained on payment of readmission fee of **Rs. 100/- within 7 days** after duly permitted by the Principal. After expiry of 7 days the student will have to bear a re-admission fee of **Rs. 200/-**. The recommendation of the teacher and in addition to it, the Principal may impose extra fine depending upon the gravity of his/her absence. A student struck off for the second time in a session from any class will be ineligible for re-admission to the class.

## Leave Rules

- ✓ Students should get their leave applications recommended by the teachers.
- ✓ Leave for 2 days will be sanctioned by the senior tutors / subject teacher.
- ✓ Leave for more than 2 days will be sanctioned by the Principal.

## College Students Central Association (CSCA)

The College Students Central Association is formed every year as per the rules laid down by Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla from time to time. Presently the selection for various posts of this association is done through merit i.e. indirect selection mode.

## Parents Teachers Association (PTA)

To encourage community participation in education Parent Teachers Association (PTA) under section 2.33 to 2.33.7 of the HP Education Code, 2001, has been established. It is a non-political body for better coordination and interaction between parents and teachers for improvement of academic standards and infra structural facilities of the college.

## Bhiuri (Yearly Periodical)

In order to encourage creative abilities among the students, the college magazine '*Bhiuri*' is published annually. It consists of a number of sections and each section has one staff editor & one student editor. Students are asked to contribute original authored poems, articles, stories, memories, experiences, and so on giving it a literary tinge. It also exhibits a panoramic summary of year-long activities in the form of photography.

## **Old Students Association (OSA)**

Old Student's Association (OSA) of Govt. Degree College Kaffota is a registered association of college which came into existence in 2023. The college conducts meetings time to time with the members of Old Student's Association (OSA) which provides a platform to the former students to contribute suggestions with respect to the functioning and infrastructure of the college.

### **ANNUAL PRIZE DISTRIBUTION FUNCTION**

Various awards and prizes are given to the meritorious students in academics and to those who **excel in sports and co-curricular activities** on the Annual Prize Distribution Function as per college norms.

### **CAREER GUIDANCE AND PLACEMENT CELL**

Career Guidance cell guides the students regarding different career prospects open to them. Clippings of advertisements for different posts/training programs from various newspapers are also displayed on the notice board for the benefit of students. Sometimes, resource persons are also invited.

### **INTERNAL COMPLAINT COMMITTEE**

Internal Complaints Committee (ICC) is constituted under sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 4, as outlined in the UGC (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal of Sexual Harassment of Women Employees and Students in Higher Educational Institutions) Regulations, 2015, to address and prevent sexual harassment.

### **WOMEN DEVELOPMENT CELL (WDC: SHAKTI)**

Women Development Cell—SHAKTI serves as a platform to address and advocate for women's issues, fostering an environment of gender equality and inclusivity on campus.

### **ROAD SAFETY CLUB**

Role of Road Safety Club is to promote safe practices among students, both as drivers and pedestrians. By organizing various events, campaigns, and workshops, the club aims to educate students about traffic rules, responsible driving, and the importance of wearing seat belts, avoiding distracted driving, and respecting speed limits.

### **DRUG ABUSE CELL**

Drug Abuse Club in our college aims to create a safe and supportive environment for students to openly discuss and address the issue of drug abuse on campus.

### **DISASTER MANAGEMENT CELL**

In order to encourage students our college provides facilities for indoor and outdoor games. Students are encouraged to participate in any of the games and prepare for inter-college tournaments organized by Himachal Pradesh University to earn name and fame and establish oneself in sports also.

### **EDUCATIONAL TOURS**

For the overall development of the students stream-wise, educational tours are arranged from time to time. The purpose of the trip is usually observation, non-experimental research or to provide students with experiences outside their everyday activities, such as going & camping with teachers and their classmates.

## **General Instructions**

- Before filling up the online application form, the Applicant(s) are advised to read carefully the Notification/Advertisement for the courses (s)/Exam(s) and also ensure that he/she is eligible as per the criteria as prescribed in the Advertisement Notice.
- The application received through any other mode (offline etc.) will not be accepted and summarily rejected.
- Online Application process must be completed (including Form Filling and Submit Prospectus Fee) before last date fixed for submission of online form as mentioned in the Notification/Advertisement, after which the web link will automatically be disabled and no subsequent correspondence will be entertained in that respect.
- The Applicant(s) applying for the admission should ensure that they fulfil all eligibility criteria as prescribed for admission. Their admission at all stages will be purely provisional subject to satisfying the prescribed eligibility conditions.
- College takes up verification of eligibility conditions with reference to original documents at subsequent stages of admission process.
- The list of selected Applicant(s) will be drawn in the order of their merit.

## **Ragging is a Criminal Offence**

**PROHIBITION OF RAGGING ACT, 2009** defines “Ragging as doing any act” by disorderly conduct to a student of an educational institution, which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raising apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to the student. Such disorderly conduct include, teasing or abusing or playing practical jokes on causing hurt to students or asking a student to do any act or perform something which such student will not be willing to do in ordinary course.

Students found accused of such act by the way of indulging in or outside the college premises shall be liable to punishment as per the guidelines given by UGC in the light of Hon’ble Supreme Court directions. The possible punishment shall be anyone or the combination of the following:

- Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- Suspension/withdrawing of Scholarship and other financial benefits.
- Debarring from appearing in examination and other evaluation process.
- Debarring from representing the institution in any intra-college/inter-college/inter-university/international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
- Suspension and rustication from the college.
- Cancellation of Admission.
- Special Fine depending upon the gravity of the offence
- Collective Punishment: When the persons committing or abetting the crime of Ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

**Note:** The cases pertaining to the Ragging will be reported to the police and will be dealt as per Himachal Pradesh Education Institution (Prohibition of Ragging) Act 2009 according to which Ragging has been declared as a ‘Cognizable and Non-Bailable Offence’. Any student convicted of Ragging related offence will be punished with the imprisonment of up to 3 years or fine of Rs. 50,000 or both.

**It is mandatory for all the students to fill online Anti-ragging declaration. The hard copy or reference number generated has to be submitted along with application form.**

Any Act Resulting in:

- Mental/physical/sexual Abuse
- Verbal Abuse
- Indecent Behaviour
- Criminal Intimidation/wrongful Restraint
- Undermining Human Dignity
- Financial Exploitation/extortion
- Use Of Force

### A STUDENT INDULGING IN RAGGING CAN BE:

- Cancellation of admission.
- Suspension from attending classes.
- Withholding/withdrawing Scholarship/Fellowship and other benefits.
- Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process.
- Withholding results.
- Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament or youth festival etc.
- Collective punishment : when the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified the institution shall resort to collective punishment as a deterrent to ensure community pressure on potential ragger.
